Oxidation Firing:

A firing where the atmosphere inside the kiln has sufficient supplies of oxygen to react with the glaze and clay body surfaces (and thus produce the colors characteristic of this). Electric kilns are synonymous with oxidation firing. This typically applies to electric kilns, where reduction firing uses other means of fuel (wood or gas).
